Sharing Technology Across Schools

We have some very engaging materials (robotics, k'nex, magnatiles, etc...) that have been loaned out in the past few years. At this point in time, these kits will not be loaned out as we are currently working through the questions and concerns around health and safety protocols as well as the human resources required to sustain this practice.

NTIP

This year, we will begin supporting NTIP with our 1st year permanent hires. We are currently determining the list of eligible candidates and support will begin in a virtual format. We will share a survey to determine initial needs and plan accordingly.

OFIP Tutoring

Our tentative plan for OFIP tutoring will focus on an online, synchronous instruction model. Applications will be available to schools at the beginning of October and the format will be revised to reflect the virtual environment. The goal will be to focus on mathematics from grades 2-6 as well as English Language Learners.

School Libraries (Collaborative Learning Spaces)

All of the elementary libraries are currently formally closed.

For the time being, our library technicians are located at one school only, where they are working to support supervision and other assigned duties. With the permission of the principal and a plan in place to manage it, library resources could be used for classroom <u>instructional purposes only</u>, as long as they remain within **one classroom cohort**, do not go home and are quarantined when they return to the library.

Virtual Libraries



Our library technicians will be working together to create Chatham-Kent, Sarnia-Lambton and French Immersion virtual libraries that will be updated monthly. They will be available on October 19 and then updated monthly. These can be shared with students on teacher's digital platforms as well as posted on school websites.

Virtual School Update

The Virtual school currently includes approximately 50 elementary staff and 25 secondary staff to support 750 elementary students and 450 secondary students.

FSL - Core

We have added some new resources for Core French this year.

French Cultural Kits- Grades 4-5: Theser FSL Cultural Literacy Packs enhance the cultural component of your French program. The Grade 4 Kit focuses on francophones in Ontario, and the Grade 6 Kit focuses on francophones in Quebec. These kits were delivered to each school.

New Resource for Grades 7-8: *Mon réseau, ma vie* consists of four function-driven modules per grade. Each module's opener presents student learning goals (À l'oral et à l'écrit....), as well as the three contexts of the module (*Contexte A, Contexte B, Contexte C*). At the end of each context is an *assessment of* learning task. All FSL teachers participated in professional learning regarding this new resource.
