# Director of Education Announces Principal and Vice Principal Placements for September 2023

The Director of Education has announced changes to the Principal and Vice Principal assignments for the 2023-2024 school year. The changes this year are necessary due to several factors, most significantly the announced retirements of Ursuline College Vice Principal Ray Power, St. Angela Merici Vice Principal Mary Ann McCrae; and the temporary absence of St. Anne Blenheim Vice Principal Alishia Thompson, who will commence a leave beginning September 2023.

"In addition to reassignments resulting from these retirements, changes in school leadership can be a catalyst for growth, both at the school and system level," says Scott Johnson, Director of Education. "Experience and workload are also considerations in the annual review of the tenure and career path of our principals and vice principals. Additional changes in our vice principal assignments will reflect an increase in VP support for the next school year."

Ray Power began his career as a Catholic educator in 1990 with the Kent County Roman Catholic Separate School Board. His first assignment was as an elementary teacher at the former Our Lady of Help School in Wallaceburg. In 1995, Ray was appointed to administration as Vice Principal and eventually Principal. Throughout his time in Catholic leadership, he served several elementary schools, including St. Anne Blenheim, St. Joseph Tilbury, and Monsignor Uyen. In 2002, he was appointed Vice Principal at Ursuline College Chatham and in 2013 he was named Principal. In February 2022, Ray stepped back from the school's principalship to return to the role of Vice Principal.

Mary Ann McCrae began teaching with St. Clair Catholic at the former St. Agnes Catholic School in 2002. In 2006, she moved to the Catholic Education Centre, where she held the position of System Resource Teacher – Itinerant Behaviour for seven years. In 2013, she moved to Ursuline College, where she was appointed Acting Vice Principal, then Vice Principal in 2014. In 2016, she was appointed Acting Principal at the former St. Agnes and in 2017 she moved into the role of Principal at St. Ursula Catholic School. In 2020, Mary Ann returned to the role of VP at UCC and in 2023 she was appointed Vice Principal at St. Angela Merici Catholic School.

"Ray and Mary Ann are two outstanding Catholic leaders," says Mr. Johnson. "Ray's extensive knowledge and experience, his unflappable manner and his kind, courteous and humble nature will be missed, by students and staff alike, both at UCC and across the system; and Mary Ann's warmth, compassion and steadfast commitment to her vocation have been greatly valued by the students and families she served and the staff with whom she has worked."
