8. Revision of CFAC Policy 6.4

Daniela asked the grade 12 students to assist with the grade 9 retreats, and reported that it went very well. The grade 12 students really enjoyed having a role in leading the retreat.

Shannon Thunderbird presented at both St. Patrick's and St. Christopher.

Joan Martell reported from St. John Fisher that their students involved in the Kingdom Assignment project raised over \$1,500. Students are also enjoying the trailer *The One Called Jesus* at their school this week.
