A. PRESENTATIONS

1. Student Achievement Plan

Scott Johnson

- Scott shared the change in Ministry process for board reporting. Every board in the province must do this report on these same criteria. There are 14 indicators provided by the Ministry. Comparisons are made between the 73 school boards on the 14 criteria.
- The Ministry priorities are: Achievement of Learning Outcomes in Core Academic Skills, Preparation of Students for Future Success, and Student Engagement & Well-being.
- Our board Strategic Plan will remain in place and will remain our priority along with the work teachers do with, and for students, every day.
- Much of the data is based on grades 3, 6, and 9 EQAO scores from all school boards.
- The Ministry will ask what the board plan is to improve their scores if they fall below provincial standards. As of April 2, 2024, SCCDSB has developed and posted on the board website a plan to improve where our scores are below Ministry standards. There are Action Plan items to support each of the Ministry priorities.
- The Ministry will provide new data to the board twice per year. The Director will share the new data as it is received.

2. LD@Home

- Martin is an educational consultant for LDAO, LD@School, and LD@Home.
- The Learning Disabilities Association of Ontario (LDAO) is a registered charity dedicated to improving the lives of children, youth, and adults with learning





disabilities. LDAO offers many resources, services, information, venues, and products designed to help people with LDs and ADHD, as well as parents, teachers, and other professionals.

- LD@School includes a website as well as the Eduator's Institute (summer conference). LD@School provides Ontario educators with information, resources, and research related to teaching students with LDs. The website features resources and professional development materials in a variety of formats. LD@School highlights evidence-based, evidence-informed, and practice-informed approaches, practices, and strategies that can be put directly to use in the classroom.
- LD@Home was created to help bring resources to Ontario households impacted by learning disabilities. Information is geared to families. Resources often include transcripts and other materials. Connections and information on local LD chapters and partner organizations are shared.
- All resources at LD@School and LD@Home are free to use and are translated to French.

6. Learning Disabilities Association of Chatham-Kent Gabriela Todino

- There are three types of B.E.S.T. summer programs; 2-week programs that will run from July 22-August 1, 2024; all are fee-for-service.
- The programs will run for half a day and are for social skills, tutoring, and SOAR which is a secondary school preparation course for students in grades 7 to 9.
- Social skills and tutoring sessions will run Monday through Thursday mornings or afternoons, for different groups of children: Kindergarten to grade 4 and grade 4 to grade 8.
- A full day camp is possible when two half day sessions are attended on the same day for the 2 weeks.

1. Mental Health and Wellbeing Updates

- April 4, 2024 all principals were trained in "Leading Mentally Healthy Schools 2.0."
 As a result, a small group of principals will now come together to brainstorm how the information can be shared across the system.
- Mental Health Week is the week of May 6-10, 2024. The theme is "Healing through Compassion"
- School-wide events focused on this theme will take place across the system.
- Summer work will be funded to provide mental health support to students throughout the summer months. The plan is for SEL learning camps to occur, however, it will be based on the funding received for summer programming.
- Three Oaks Cabin is a retreat centre for first responders and rural farmers struggling with mental health and wellbeing. A planning visit will occur for the purpose of exploring how we can collaborate and work together to provide this type of service.

The program will provide the students with the opportunity to enter the workforce upon competition of high school.
