### 3. Review of SEAC Minutes - April 15, 2024 (Motion)

#### A. PRESENTATIONS

### **1. Amethyst Provincial Demonstration School**Bonnie Grace, Kathryn Thiel

- PPM 89 One-year high intensive academic intervention program for students with severe learning disabilities
- Three provincial demonstration schools with this mandate throughout Ontario; Amethyst, located in London, serves southwestern Ontario populations
- Candidates must have a learning disability diagnosed by a registered psychologist and generally are a minimum of 2-3 years behind in reading
- Students are in Grades 6-10, stay onsite from Monday-Friday in a dorm setting with support from a team including teachers, a consulting psychologist, a speech and language pathologist and nurse
- Classes typically include 6-8 students with a maximum of 50 students in the school
- Key strategies include research-driven pedagogy, evidence-based direct explicit instruction programming, and research-informed technology
- Emphasis on literacy with 200 minutes of direct teacher instruction, along with supplemental computer reading programs
- Direct instruction math programming is also provided
- Year-long application process for boards to apply: A) Consultation process; B) Phase
  1: Information Gathering due Nov 1, C) Phase 2: Binder Application Due Feb 1, D)
  Interviews March-April





• Important assessment criteria for Phase 2 next year: Recent Psychoeducational and Speech and Language Pathologist assessment (both within 3 years of Feb 1, 2025), vision and audiological testing (within one year - family responsibility)

### 2. Life Skills Program Review

Jennifer Morrow

- Program reviews are completed on a cyclical basis; this review focused on secondary school life skills programs
- Research-based literature review demonstrated clear benefits of inclusion for both neurodiverse and neurotypical students
- Data was collected through surveys to stakeholders (students, teachers, parents, EAs, administrators)
- Evidence of individualized programming and the provision of a safe environment for all students
- Six key recommendation areas: improved communication (among teams, ongoing home/school meetings); curriculum development (continuum of learning, provision of high-quality learning materials); training opportunities (for EAs, life skills and mainstream classroom teachers); capacity building to support equity, diversity and inclusion; transition planning (with families and community partners); improved documentation and reporting procedures (i.e., IEPs, IPRCs and meeting minutes)
